

GETTING TO CHALE AND NITON



It's easy to get to the Isle of Wight using sustainable transport. Here's how you get to Chale and Niton...

TRAVELLING FROM LYMINGTON

This is a very handy link if you've been staying in the New Forest.

From Lymington

- Head for Lymington Pier.
 You can get here by train from Brockenhurst and Lymington Town.
 5 minutes
- Take the Wightlink ferry from Lymington Pier to Yarmouth. 40 minutes
- Take the route 7 bus from Yarmouth Harbour to Newport bus station, 30 minutes.
- Catch the route 6 bus to Chale or Niton.
 23-36 minutes.

ARRIVE AT DESTINATION

TRAVELLING FROM SOUTHAMPTON

This is accessible from all parts of the country with direct links from London.

From Southampton Central train station or coach station

- Take the freeQuayconnect bus toTown Quay terminal 2.10 minutes
- Take the Red Jet Hispeed to West Cowes.
 25 minutes
- Jump on the route 1 bus to Newport bus station.
 25 minutes
- Catch the route 6 bus to Chale or Niton.23-36 minutes.

ARRIVE AT DESTINATION

TRAVELLING FROM PORTSMOUTH

This is accessible from all parts of the country with direct links from London.

From Portsmouth Harbour train station (follow the 'Wightlink' sign at the end of the platform)

- Take the Wightlink
 Catamaran to Ryde Pier
 Head. 22 minutes
- Walk to Ryde Esplanade or take the Island Line train. 5 minutes
- Take the route 9 bus from Ryde bus station (platform B) to Newport bus station. 30 minutes
- Catch the route 6 bus to Chale or Niton.23-36 minutes.

ARRIVE AT DESTINATION

TRAVELLING FROM SOUTHSEA

This is the fastest crossing to the Island (foot passengers only). It's near Portsmouth.

From Portsmouth & Southsea train station

- Cross the road and take the Hoverbus (bus stop C) to the Southsea Hoverport. 15 minutes
- Take the Hovercraft to Ryde Esplanade.10 minutes
- Take the route 9 bus from Ryde bus station (platform B) to Newport bus station. 30 minutes
- Catch the route 6 bus to Chale or Niton.23-36 minutes.

ARRIVE AT DESTINATION
